Building Voice and Style: Using Phatic Utterances I just like saying Phat.

Phatic utterances constitute a mode of action just in their being voiced. In short, a phatic utterance communicates not ideas but attitude, the speaker's presence, and the speaker's intention of being sociable.

Phatic utterances are nearly content free. They serve mainly as reminders, reminders to the readers that they are in contact with a mind, a person, a personality. They can help us understand the ETHOS behind the writing and connect with that ethos. They also serve to indicate and remind the reader of the closeness or distance by the writer to the topic. Think of them as the equivalent of a physical signal, a nod, a wink, a smile or frown, in a conversation.

They imply a closer relationship between writer and reader.
